What is a study?

• A research study is something you do when you want to learn about something or find out something new.

Why are we doing this study?

• We are doing this study to find out how we can help children with itchy eczema to scratch less.

What will happen if I take part and what do I have to do?

- You and your parent or carer will have an interview with a researcher where you can share your ideas about eczema and scratching.
- You and your parent or carer may also be asked to take part in a virtual focus group with 2-5 other children and their parents or carers. Here, you will test our website that has tips to help you stop scratching.

Do I have to take part?

- No, you do not have to take part if you do not want to.
- We will not tell your doctors if you decide to take part or not. Your current or future care will not be affected whether you decide to take part or not.
- If you do decide to take part, and your parents or carers agree, you will both sign a form to show this.



• You can change your mind at any time without having to say why.

Will the study upset or help me?

- No, the study should not be upsetting.
- Your ideas will be very helpful to us and we hope that the information we get from the study will help other children who have eczema.
- We hope you will find the material helps you to reduce scratching your skin.

What if I want to stop taking part in the study?

• You can stop whenever you want and you won't have to tell us why, we won't mind!





What if I want to ask a question?

- Your parent or carer has been given lots of information about the study so you can ask them.
